Fees

Michael's rates for Author's Visits are \$600.00 for a half day (2 groups in a half day). Please see the group sizes in this information package. Michael's Sessions

Author's Visits

Michael Arvaarluk Kusugak is a gifted and mesmerizing storyteller. In Inuit culture, storytellers learn their craft by listening to stories told to them as children. These stories are ancient and compelling, told over and over again changing slightly with each teller's telling. Michael was introduced to the stories by his grandmother while he was traveling by dog team living in igloos and sod huts at the Arctic Circle. He weaves these stories with stories of his life, a life of rapid change and adaptation. Michael's storytelling will transport you to another world.

Michael's sessions are usually 1 hour in length. Michael can do up to 4 sessions in a school day, 2 in the morning and 2 in the afternoon depending on the schedule in your area.

New** Hands on Learning Sessions

Michael's wife Gerry brings a variety of items that the children can touch, try on, try out and to experience. Items such as an Inuit drum, try on an amouti, look at and touch tools and implements, samples of fur, and clothing like, Kaamik, sealskin mitts, duffel socks, crocheted hats, and other items. What's a Qulliq (stone seal oil lamp)? Look at a scale model of a kayak to see how it is constructed and much more. With 2 or more sessions they are held in a separate area from the storytelling so that children can see items that Michael talks about in his stories. If one session is booked the Hands on portion follows the storytelling session. These sessions are included in the fee for the author's sessions.

Group Size

For author's visits and hands on learning sessions, we like the children to be grouped in grade/age levels. You can combine classes but please keep the groups in the following age ranges and group size. The younger grade groups K - 3 should be smaller, 50 - 70 per group. The older grades 4 and up can be a bit bigger with 100 children max.

Room Preparation

<u>Author's session:</u> Michael needs a chair, a small table and a jug, or bottle of water. It is important to have the children sitting on the floor in front of him. A library or classroom with an area large enough to accommodate the group is best. <u>Michael asks that you avoid using the gym if at all possible.</u>

<u>Hands on Learning Session</u>: Gerry needs a separate room with a large table, a chair, water, a screen or white board for showing some photographs. The gym can be used for Hands on Learning Sessions. If the requested space is not available please let us know so that we can make the necessary adjustments.
