All the books have been carefully leveled according to specific factors including: number of words per book, number of lines per page, size of print, relationship between print and picture, introduction of high-frequency words, number of repetitions of phrases and new words, and sentence structure. The original 50 titles are included on the North American Reading Recovery (R) book list.
