














Graphic novel format nonours the oral torytelling tradition.

Raven Tales is broadcast on Aboriginal Peoples Television Network (APTN) and has been reviewed and approved by National Geographic via the All Roads Film Project, the BC Ministry of Education as part of the Aboriginal Enhancement program, and the Smithsonian Institute via the National Museum of the American Indian (NMAI). The creators also worked closely with a number of tribal councils including the Coast Salish, Haida, Comanche, Apache, Zuni, Navajo, Kwakwaka'wakw, and Cherokee.
