Judy Bourne Memorial Scholarships

his scholarship is in recognition of Judy Bourne, an inspirational woman of Cree Ancestry. Judy was a devoted wife and mother of six children. She was well known for her athletic and coaching abilities, particularly as a nationally and internationally recognized volleyball coach. Judy taught for many years in a variety of subjects at various grade levels. From 1984-1989 she was the Executive Director of the M'akola Housing Society, a Society responsible for developing urban native housing on Vancouver Island. Under her guidance, the Society became a model for many housing projects across Canada. During her tenure she, along with well-known artist Roy Henry Vickers, was chosen by the Aboriginal Nations Education Department as a role model for her contribution to the Aboriginal Communities of this area. VALUE: \$1,600.00
