

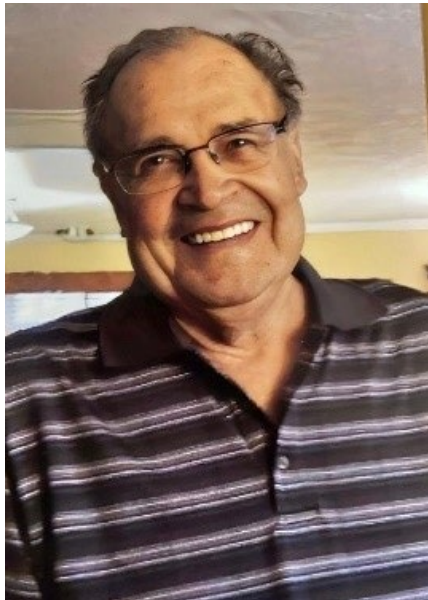

ABOUT GEORGE COOK



The George Cook Scholarship Fund was created to honour the life, teachings, leadership, and unwavering commitments Elder George Cook made to Decolonization, the Friendship Centre Movement, Affordable Housing, and Urban Planning for Indigenous communities across British Columbia.

Tłatłatlawis (George Cook), born in Alert Bay in 1929 at the Cook family home, descended from noble lines that reached back to several Kwakwaka'wakw tribes, the Komoks, Northern Vancouver Island Coast Salish and the Mowachaht of Friendly Cove. George stepped into his political and community leadership by becoming the Chief Councilor of the Namgis in 1969, and was known for his thoughtfulness, humility, and kindness. George was a part of many significant moments in British Columbia's and Canada's history – such as advocating against the White Paper policy and the possible devastation it could have caused Indigenous communities or being present for the formation of the Union of BC Indian Chiefs.

Elder George Cook served as M'akola Housing Society and M'akola Development Services' Elder Advisor, ensuring M'akola weaves commitments made to improving living conditions for Indigenous peoples while reinforcing traditional practices and cultural beliefs through every aspect of the Societies' work.

M'akola Housing Society and M'akola Development Services are honoured to present this award in Tłatłatlawis' honour.

ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

The George Cook Scholarship will provide a financial award, and an opportunity to participate in MDS' annual summer internship.

- Scholarship Amount: One-time award of **\$5,000.00**
- MDS Annual Summer Internship Placement: Opportunity to participate in a paid, full-time, 3-month (May – August) internship to gain real-world planning, development, Indigenous

relations, and affordable housing industry experience.

- Work on projects across British Columbia related to affordable housing development, operations, policy, and planning.
- Office locations in Victoria/Langford, Courtenay, and Vancouver.

BRITISH COLUMBIA REGIONS

Up to two scholarships will be awarded over **six regions** to Indigenous students enrolled in a Post-Graduate Urban planning program.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE

- Indigenous Students in Canada living in British Columbia.
- Applicants of any age.
- New or continuing students accepted into a Post-Graduate Urban Planning program in Canada.

Demonstrated financial need, as well as life experiences, challenges, and triumphs, will be taken into consideration.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

- **What qualifies as a Post-Graduate Urban Planning program?** A Post-Graduate Urban Planning program may include a Master's program, post-graduate diploma or certificate program in any field related to Urban, Regional, and Community Planning, Development, Indigenous Relations, Housing or Public Health.
- **If it is a Multi-Year/Term Program can students apply for the future Year/Term? Or if they have already enrolled, could they retroactively apply for the M'akola Bursary?** The program is intended for future use only and can be applied towards a new enrollment or the next year/semester of a multi-year course.
- **If a student is successful in securing a M'akola Scholarship from us, and are in a multi-year program, can they reapply for each year?** Winners of M'akola Scholarships may only apply once.
- **If a student was unsuccessful in securing a M'akola Scholarship, can they reapply?** Yes, all students who have yet to obtain a M'akola Bursary are encouraged to apply again.

- **If a student is successful in securing the George Cook Scholarship, do they have to participate in the Internship?** No. Internship participation is not a mandatory requirement to be eligible for the scholarship. However, it is a unique opportunity to gain real-world work experience in Urban Planning, Affordable and Non-Market Housing Development, Construction Management, Community Engagement, Facilitation, and Housing Policy and Research. MDS strongly encourages successful students to seriously consider participating in MDS' annual paid summer internship program.

REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY

Please ensure you include all the following when applying. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

- Completed Application Form
- Cover Letter, describing the following:
 - Your future plans and how your chosen course/program will support them.
 - Why you feel you are a potential candidate for this award, highlighting examples of your commitment to your community, and your interests in Planning and/or Development.
 - Your experience as an Indigenous person and how that has helped shape your decision to attend school.
- Reference Letter
 - From school counsellor, administrator, teacher, employer, mentor, or community member.
- Current Transcript
- Proof of Acceptance in a Post-Graduate Urban Planning program
 - A copy of your class schedule, proof of enrollment, course contract, or a letter of acceptance for the following Fall semester. Your name and program should be clearly shown.
- Proof of Canadian Residency, examples:
 - BC Drivers Licence, BC Identity Card, BC Services Card, a recent BC Hydro Bill (in your name and address), or any recent Provincial Government issued letter (in your name and address).
- Completed Void Cheque/Direct Deposit Form
 - See the last page of this document.
 - *If a cheque is preferred, please let us know. This option will take longer to receive.*

Note: Scholarships must be claimed within 3 months of the date awarded.

HOW TO APPLY

2. Complete and sign the application, and ensure you include:
 - Ensure you have attached all documents from the *Requirements to Apply* section.
