
This action plan outlines significant actions the Province will undertake in consultation and cooperation with Indigenous Peoples over the next five years; 2022 - 2027" (DRIPA)

Together, they guide the work of Indigenous Education throughout the district.

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


SD 61 Indigenous Education Department Library




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
SD 61 Indigenous Giant Floor Map


Resource Highlight Grades 6 - 12 Canadian Geographic Indigenous Peoples Atlas of Canada

This set of books provides excellent information on Canadian Indigenous People. They can be used as stand alone books or as a companion to the map.

The Indigenous Education Department has purchased the Indigenous People's Atlas of Canada Giant Floor Map. This is an incredible resource and provides the opportunity to view Canada through a very different lens. This floor map does not have any political borders. Its distinguishing features are Indigenous languages, treaty borders and terrain, as well as Indigenous place names. It is a beautiful example of the vastness and diversity of Canada's terrain and of the Indigenous Nations across our country. Important thing to consider before requesting this map;

- Space does your school have space for the map? The map is 8 meters by 11 meters. It takes up about half the space of a gymnasium, with additional space needed for students to gather around the perimeter of the map.
- The map weighs approximately 150 pounds and requires 2 or more people to set up and put away.
- If using your gym to display the map, check gym rentals incase the map needs to be put away each day
- To make borrowing the map worthwhile, encourage your entire school to take part in activities while the map is at your school
- Our district currently has 2 maps available to be borrowed and the borrowing period is for 2 weeks
- All teachers are encouraged to teach lessons on the map while the map is housed at their school
- The map is for K -12 and comes with lessons plans and activities for all grade levels as well as supplies included with the map kit. These lessons should be reviewed ahead of borrowing the map so that a plan of how the map will be used is established. All lesson plans as well as additional resources can be found online here:
